Exercises – 9:30 am Wednesdays and Fridays

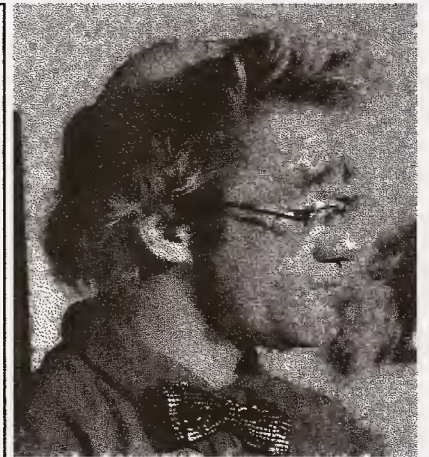
Cards and, if possible, carpet bowling – 2:00 pm Wednesdays and Fridays

NOTICE

TO ALL USERS OF THE HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

The Town's transfer station (dump) is locked with hours of operation for winter being **Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.**

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **not** be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;
2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
4. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
5. Petroleum contaminated soils;
6. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
7. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
8. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
9. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK);
10. Acid-filled automotive batteries;

Propane tanks;

Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

Painted or stained lumber or wood paneling.

There are designated areas for steel and trees or untreated/unpainted lumber.

Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

If you have any questions please feel free to contact the office or any councilor.

Sask Environment has very strict requirements. Several times they have found items at our transfer station which are not allowed. If we don't comply with their requirements the transfer station could be closed.

Recycle Bins are now located behind the Centennial.

Did you Know??

All operators of power driven pleasure craft Boats (including PWC and motorized sailboats) used for recreational purposes within Canada are now required to have a Pleasure Craft Operator Card.

As a service to our Customers, Simonsen Enterprises Inc., is anticipating holding an examination session in Hanley in January or early February, should there be enough interest.

If you need your Operator's card and would like to attend, please give us a call and add your name to the interest list.
