The Hanley/Rosedale Fire Department is getting close to finishing another busy year. In the last 12 months we have responded to 4 car accidents, 23 medical calls, and 13 fires. We have also had many training dates, meetings, and fundraising activities.

More members are required to respond to calls as in a few of the calls manpower has been at a premium. If you're interested in becoming a volunteer, contact Fire Chief Les Kroeger or any current member.

We currently have 2 registered people to respond to medical calls. As this is the majority of our calls, the need for more volunteers is required. The Saskatoon Health Region hosts first responder courses throughout the region. Locations are to be determined based on numbers and location of the applicants. If an area has 6 people it will likely be hosted in that community if possible.

Hanley Centennial Hall

The Centennial Hall Committee held an open meeting of the Executive and Community on Oct. 22/13.

A number of issues were discussed. A new "Articles of Incorporation" was adopted by bylaw to update information that was included on the original; the Coke machine was to be advertised on Kijiji; and a lighting systems presentation by Pristine LED Inc. resulting in the resolution to conduct a lighting audit by this company. The insurance premiums for the building and contents was discussed because of an increase which resulted in a resolution to invoice the main building users percentages of the total based on the size of space each user has. The group at the meeting decided to advertise for kitchen cleaning by a volunteer organization for that organization to make some extra funds; and the situation of coffee makers was discussed.

The Centennial Hall Committee welcomed the Hanley Legion to the facility. The Legion members have displayed some of their memorabilia and will be holding their monthly meetings in the clubroom as they have sold their hut.

The item on the agenda that held the most interest and discussion was the rental rates resulting in the new rates to be implemented in January of 2014. You will see that we have added an "additional day" fee so that in the event that you want to decorate a day or two before your function, you aren't tying up the facility with no rental revenue. We have also decreased the fee for ½ day use of the hall and clubroom.

The rentals are the only form of revenue that the Hall committee has and encourage the community to use the facility to its potential. NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE**October Meeting Highlights:**

A new member of Council was sworn in at the October meeting. Doreen Smith was elected by acclamation and dove right into the position.

After a spring and summer of Governance Committee meetings for the DRWU, the Council accepted the recommendations of this committee and adopted a bylaw to enter into agreement to establish a public utility board. Administrator Darice Carlson was appointed to the "new" DRWU board.

An offer to purchase Block 9, Plan H5352 was accepted from the Hanley Golf Association.

An offer to purchase Lots 14 – 16, Block 5, Plan H1032 was conditionally accepted with minor changes to the offer from AgVantage Development Corp.

A Cemetery Committee was sanctioned by the Council with Joyce Armstrong taking the lead to form an advisory committee. She will be looking for volunteers for this committee so if you are interested, please contact the Town Office.

Approval was given for the Administrator to attend the 2nd Municipal Capacity Development Program conference Dec. 2 & 3 in Regina.

November Meeting Highlights:

Another nuisance declaration was made. The Council would like to remind ratepayers of the Town to please tend to your property so reminders and declarations need not be made. The Town has been complemented on the tidiness of the general community but there are areas that need to be addressed.

The Transfer Station rates were reviewed over the last 3 months with comparisons from other communities and a bylaw was adopted to amend the rates. As of the end of August, there was an approximate deficit of \$7,500. This deficit is covered with your town taxes. Richard McGregor will continue to serve as Deputy Mayor for an additional year.

On behalf of the Town of Hanley Council and Staff, we wish to take this opportunity to wish you all a Merry and safe Christmas/Holiday Season, followed by the happiest of New Years!
