### LORAAS DISPOSAL SERVICES LTD.

The following is a reminder from Loraas concerning garbage bins.

“Communities utilizing our door-to-door residential poly waste carts should remind residents to:

- Have carts roadside by 7am on scheduled pick up day (Monday)
- Bag all waste materials to avoid wind blown litter; waste to be level full with lid closed
- Not to dispose of construction, sod, roofing or other heavy materials in their carts (Max cart weight per lift 22kg)
- Not to dispose of any hazardous or regulated waste in their container
- Return cart to safe residence location after collection; do not leave roadside for safety reasons”

Also, based on Loraas guidelines, the Town has passed a bylaw stating:

“The municipality shall supply one garbage cart to each customer which will be the responsibility of the customer. If any bin is damaged and needs repair or replacement, the customer shall be responsible for the cost of repair or replacement of the initial or any subsequent garbage carts.

The customer shall be responsible for placing the garbage cart roadside by 7:00 a.m. on scheduled pick up day. The garbage cart shall be returned to safe residence location after collection within 12 hours of pickup. Failure to remove cart will result in a contravention of this bylaw and the cart may be removed from the customer property. Reinstatement of services will commence with a paid penalty of \$50.00.”

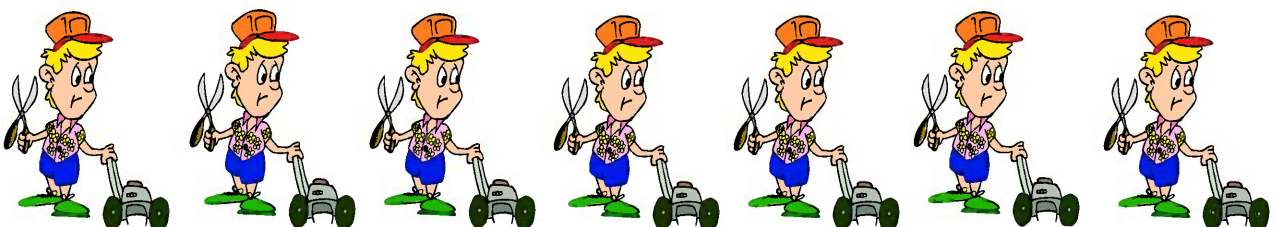

## DUNDURN RURAL WATER UTILITY

### Phase III Water Project - Construction Progresses Through Winter Months!!!

The Dundurn Rural Water Utility continues to work very diligently towards the completion of the Phase III rural water project. With construction better than 60% complete and running within budget, the entire system is expected to be fully functional by the end of 2011. Service should become operative in August to September of 2011 for South Corman Park users and the Towns of Dundurn and Hanley.

Construction of the Phase A Mainline portion of the project is very near completion, pending the installation of seven (7) to eight (8) additional miles of large diameter pipe. These sections of pipe, currently being constructed by KMS Construction, merit extensive construction efforts due to heavy frost and unfavorable weather conditions. Construction will progress through the months of January and February for completion shortly thereafter.

The Phase B Project which involves construction of the service laterals and the installation of lines into homes, came to a stop in early November when ploughing was abandoned due to winter conditions. The majority of construction remaining for the Phase B tender is in the southern regions of the project; mainly the Towns of Dundurn and Hanley and the surrounding rural resident connections. Phase B construction is expected to be completed by the end of summer 2011.

Collaborative efforts between SaskWater and the Dundurn Rural Water Utility are also a major factor in regards to early commissioning of the system. In October, SaskWater suggested an alternative point of connection to their supply lines. Due to the significant moisture as a result of the 2010 wet summer, an alternative connection point has been agreed to and the associated construction is expected to occur over the winter months. We are currently awaiting a special meeting with SaskWater to discuss this further.

The five major pump houses required to supply water are expected for completion in April of 2011. These pump houses will be used to pressurize, chlorinate and commission the supply mains stemming south of Saskatoon beginning at Pump house #1 in Corman Park then progressing south to Pump house #5.

Service to many rural residents in areas such as South Corman Park will follow completion of the Phase A Mainline and the SaskWater tie in as it is necessary for pressure testing, chlorination and commissioning of the entire system. Availability of potable water to rural residents is expected to begin in late summer of 2011 beginning in Corman Park. Commissioning and delivery of water to rural residents farther south will continue in a logical manner with majority of Rosedale rural residents obtaining a pressurized potable source expected sometime in the fall/early winter of 2011.

### *Dog and Cat Licenses*



Remember to purchase your dog and cat licenses for 2011 prior to Feb. 1 for \$25 each animal! Our bylaw states that “every owner of a cat or dog that is over 4 months old shall, within 30 days of becoming the owner, obtain a license for each cat or dog.” The owner of the cat or dog shall ensure that the animal wears a collar to which the tag shall be attached whenever the animal is off the premises of the owner.

The licenses expire Dec. 31 of the year purchased. If the dog or cat has an identification tattoo or microchip, the tag is not necessary but that information must be provided to the Town Office prior to Feb. 1 along with the annual license fee.

Kennel permits for breeders are \$100 per year (Jan. 1 to Dec. 31) and also must be purchased prior to Feb. 1.

### *Snow, snow and more snow*

Once again the Town is having to deal with a lot of snow this year and we still have a few more snow months to come. The Town Foreman has been grading the roads and pushing the snow off to the sides of the streets to keep the driving portion of the streets clean, however, eventually he has to move this snow to a place that won't cause problems when it starts to melt. Hence the piles of snow in pockets throughout the Town. The piles are placed in locations that when they melt the runoff should drain into the creek and out of Town and hopefully not cause any problems to basements as it flows out through the creek system.

Earlier in the newsletter there is a write up from LORAAS regarding our waste bins in the Town. Part of the write up was the guidelines for proper removal of these bins from the street after they have been emptied. This is for safety reasons (for the bins, drivers and walkers). Another reason for the timely removal of the bins is so that our Town foreman can grade the roads if it snows. Leaving your bin on the side of the road means the grader has to sweep around your bin to get down the street. Ultimately this impacts everyone trying to drive on the streets.



With this in mind the Town Council has created a bylaw that makes it mandatory that everyone removes their bin from the street in a timely fashion. This means moving the bin back onto the homeowner's property and not just at the edge of the road. There is a boulevard and/or road allowance area between the street and the homeowners property line. This is still Town property. This area allows the Town foreman to push the snow off the road and onto this property and not onto the homeowners property.

If everyone takes just a minute or so and removes their bin as soon as they can, then it will certainly make it easier to keep our streets graded and safer for driving and walking. For those that don't want to follow the guidelines, then the bylaw will prevail.

Hopefully the bylaw will have to be used in very, very few instances.
