Loraas Disposal Container—Hanley Centennial Hall

The Loraas disposal container between the Centennial Hall and the Skating Rink is not for the general use of the citizens of the Town of Hanley or the surrounding areas. It is only to be used by the Hall or the Skating Rink for their garbage disposal. This container is paid for by the Centennial Hall Board and not by the Town of Hanley. Of late, it appears that many people are using the container to dump their garbage that they either don’t want to take to the Town’s Transfer Station or is material that would not be accepted at the Transfer Station.

It is hoped that with the knowledge of who actually pays for this container, that people will refrain from using it for other than it’s intended purpose. Persons caught dumping illegally into the container are libel for any and all charges that are accrued from this dumping as it would be for any Loraas container situated throughout the Town. It would be very inconvenient for all Hall/Rink users to have the container locked, so it is hoped that with some knowledge, the illegal dumping will cease.

Notes from the Town Office

The Town of Hanley hosted the regular meeting of the WaterWolf Land Use Planning Commission on June 13.

The Executive President, Dave Cross, Mayor of the Village of Elbow, invited your Administrator to talk about the process we undertook for the Lincoln St. paving project during the "Beefs & Brags" portion of the meeting. It was nice to brag about a big project like that! Darice was also able to touch on the process we went through to repair the frost heaves throughout the Town; there are a number of municipalities that are having the same problem.

Visitors to the meeting were:

Bill Hudema from Professional Building Inspections. Bill reminded the group about the importance of building inspections and the municipal liability that goes along with building development.

Brian Cobb from Crime Stoppers. Brian told the group about the importance of the international organization and how it works from the time a person makes a call to Crime Stoppers to the point where if the tip results in a crime being solved, the reward a person can receive for helping to solve the crime.

Russ McPherson reported on the budget for 2011 – 2012 that the Executive had passed at their last Executive meeting to show a slight surplus.

Adam Toth, Junior Planner, reported on his work on the Official Community Plans and Zoning bylaws. He is still hoping to have both in place by February, 2012 so members of WaterWolf can implement them after that. Adam has become a full-time staff employed by WaterWolf to do these projects. The Town is having Adam do our Official Community Plan and new Zoning bylaw. By doing this through our WaterWolf membership, we are saving thousands of dollars that would be expended by doing it on our own therefore making this another great reason to be a member of WaterWolf.

WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

The Council passed a bylaw restricting the weight of vehicles travelling on Lincoln St. The new weight restriction is 8,000 kg for Lincoln St. and 35T for the rest of the Town. They are hoping to preserve the integrity of the streets following the paving project and the road repairs throughout the Town. The next phase of the paving project will hopefully proceed in 2012 from the Post Office to 4th St. We have ordered signage and will be erecting them as soon as possible.

ANIMAL CONTROL

The Town Office and Animal Control Officer have received complaints of dog owners not "picking up" after their dogs while out walking. Please remember to keep your dog on a leash and remove any defecation that may occur.

HEDGES AND YARDS

The Town Office has been receiving complaints of uncut grass, untrimmed hedges and general untidiness of some yards in town. In order to keep our town beautiful (and we have had compliments on that!) please maintain your yards to keep them nice and tidy.

TRANSFER STATION

The Council has hired a new Transfer Station Operator. Thank you Morris Hartwick for agreeing to “man the post”! It is a thankless position because of the rules and regulations passed down from the Ministry of Environment and Morris is enforcing those rules. Please help him out by abiding by them.

Remember to take your transfer station permit card to the Transfer Station. The Operator records each person and what items they bring to the station.

SUMMER EMPLOYEE

The Town of Hanley has hired Trygve Sira to assist the Town Foreman with his duties throughout the summer months. With Trygve’s knowledge from being employed last year with the Town it was felt he would be a great assistance to the Town in getting those ‘little things’ done. I’m sure we have all noticed him out ‘hard at work’ already. Keep up the great work Trygve!
