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ATV's in Hanley

The Town of Hanley has an ATV Bylaw. ATV's are permitted to operate on the traveled portion of any roadway only if the operator is taking the most direct route to or from his point of origin or destination within the Town to or from the corporate limits of the Town. This does not allow for ATV's driving around in Town, you **MUST** be leaving Town or coming into Town. You **MUST** also have a valid driver's license and the owner of the ATV **MUST** have insurance on the vehicle. These rules are derived from the *All Terrain Vehicle Act*.



ALLEYS

The Town Foreman does an excellent job trying to keep up with day-to-day duties but all ratepayers of the Town appreciate each other in keeping their own yards and surrounding areas tidy and well-kept (e.g. boulevards and alleys). So if you can address needs in your area of Town by cutting the boulevards and tending to alleys then everyone wins. There is a limited budget for grading and gravel so back alleys can't get the attention that they may need. If the gravel budget was directed towards the alleys then the streets would have to do without.

ANIMAL CONTROL

This is part 2 of a series of notes from “An Enlightened approach to companion animal control for Canadian municipalities”:

Most municipalities in Canada have had dog control bylaws for many years, requiring owners to take responsibility for their dogs. However, very few municipalities require cat owners to do the same. Historically, it has been widely accepted that cats are allowed to roam free. In recent years, however, with a significant increase in the number of cats, this policy is being questioned by more and more urban municipalities as well as by residents tired of neighbours’ cats digging and eliminating in their gardens and howling during the night.

Some people believe that cats should not be kept indoors and need to roam outside satisfying their hunting instincts. Others recognize that with adequate attention, companionship and the opportunity to play, cats can have a fulfilling life indoors. Indoor cats are generally healthier, don’t get lost, disturb neighbours, kill wildlife or spread disease, and generally don’t contribute to the growing problem of cat overpopulation that forces animal shelters to euthanize many thousands of cats every year.

Municipalities can address these problems by introducing bylaws that discourage breeding and that require cats to be licenced, permanently identified, and kept indoors unless in an enclosed area or supervised on a harness and leash. The implementation of effective municipal cat bylaws will result in reduced pound costs due to fewer cats roaming loose, increased revenue from licence fees and fines, a reduction in the cat population due to incentives to spay and neuter, and a reduction in conflicts between cats and the public. These issues have a greater significance in urban areas than in rural and farm areas where cats are often used to help control rodents.

When a cat licencing bylaw is introduced, the municipality will need to conduct a public awareness program to help cat owners understand the issues and what their responsibilities are. It is important that this be done in a positive way to encourage compliance. This can be done by highlighting the benefits to the animals themselves as well as the public at large. There are significant health and behavioural benefits to spaying or neutering cats and dogs.

EMERGENCY PLANNING

May 15 & 22 Crisis Response webinar – we learned the importance of the Salvation Army and Red Cross resources and local community churches for the “soft” or social services aspect of emergencies and that not all emergencies are weather related e.g. economic up-turns and down-turns; updated Emergency Plan (you can see plan at office); getprepared.gc.ca; It’s important that residents take responsibility for our own homes and families by developing personal emergency plans and 72-hour emergency kits so we can safely stay in place without taxing the local emergency system if an incident occurred.

4G SaskTel tower has backup power but if you must use a phone, keep your conversation brief and convey only vital information. If possible, use non-voice channels like text messaging, email or social media, as these use less bandwidth than phone calls and may work even when phone services has been disrupted. Social media channels will be updated during an emergency. If you have a landline, keep at least one corded phone in your home.

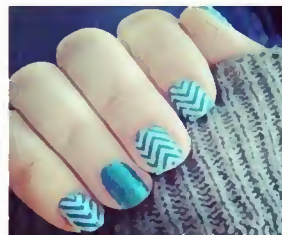

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At the May meeting:

It was decided that the Public Works Foreman should attend a 2 day training to learn how to better use the GPS and the data gained from that.

A discretionary use permit was approved for the construction of an 8-plex multi-unit dwelling.

The frozen water lines were discussed at length again with the decision made that water usage would be billed in June based on usage from June of 2013 as a number of residents, other than the usual mobile homes, had to leave water running to prevent their water lines from freezing. There were a couple residents supplying water to neighbours so these charges will be taken into consideration also at the June billing.

A summer student was hired. Naomi Derksen will be seen around Town this year cutting grass and assisting Ben with the numerous jobs he is tasked with.

A donation was made to the Hanley Seniors group for the use of their facility for the Crisis Response Webinar hosted by Circle M Ministries and the Town of Hanley.

H. J. Miller was contracted to repair the pavement in front of the Hall and to fill all the cracks along Lincoln St. (asset management!)

A new pull-behind mower was purchased.

Unfortunately the beautiful spruce tree between the library and Brightwater Insurance had become a problem with the foundations of the two buildings and had to be removed. Sawyer's was awarded the contract.

At the June meeting:

The subdivision application for the land west of the tracks was submitted to Community Planning and the Town Council recommended the approval of the application.

Nuisance yards were addressed and letters sent to residents reminding them to tidy their yards. It is so nice to have out-of-towners impressed with how nice our Town looks when they drive in!

An offer to purchase was accepted, a drainage concern was addressed, a Certificate of Completion was awarded and a waiver of liability was requested in regards to a building permit. The local RBC Branch requested a partial street closure to host their summer BBQ and was approved.

A Bylaw to amend the agreement for a District Development Appeals Board was adopted. Town Bylaws can be viewed on the Town's website www.townofhanley.ca under the Minutes, Bylaws and Financials tab.

Due to Administrator's holidays, the next Council meeting will be July 7.

ASSET MANAGEMENT

Asset management is something the Town Council has been hearing a lot of over the last few years. Although the official "plan" has not yet been established the Council has been diligently working on management of the Town's assets for as many years.

Over the last 5 years the following improvements have been made:

Sidewalks \$73,840; Culverts \$15,314; Roads \$252,933; Hydrants and valves - \$19,021; Office furniture and equipment - \$21,691; transportation equipment \$124,388; Generator \$26,531; piping at the water plant for the pipeline change-over \$64,811; Outdoor Recreational Facility at the school \$30,746; GPS to assist in mapping and management of infrastructure \$13,671; electronic water meters \$118,223; Playground equipment and campground expansion \$52,595; lift station alarm \$12,729 for a Grand Total of \$826,493. Maintenance upgrades to the Library and WTP roof and flushing all sewer mains has been completed extending the life of these assets; and a draft engineering plan has been completed for a long term watermain replacement project. The few areas targeted for the immediate future will cost just under \$1M. The watermain project will be largely dependent on the Building Canada Fund grant approval. The Town Council chose key problem areas for a 2014 replacement project (e.g. if there is a drainage channel/culvert going through the road).

Some of the above projects have been possible through grant funding whether local, Provincial, or Federal.

The Town has approximately \$10,353,314 in assets (based on actual historical and some replacement costs and NOT including the value of the lagoon, with the replacement cost being approximately \$2,800,000, or the actual replacement cost of the watermains of which the Town does not have a total replacement cost yet). Being historical costs means this does not reflect what it would cost to replace these assets. This is where the asset management plan will be a key component to assessing actual costs. Approximately \$556,416 of these assets needs immediate replacement. This could be broken down to approximately \$2,000 per household. With these numbers in mind, you can see the reason that Council has made plans improving and replacing assets over the long term rather than attempting to do all replacements in one year.

It should be noted that prior to connecting to the Dundurn Rural Water Utility, the water usage in Town was approximately 21M gallons. In 2013 that number of gallons was reduced to 10,911,401 gallons. So the people of the Town of Hanley are doing their part for water conservation!

Hanley Ag Fair

The Hanley Agricultural Fair was held on June 20th and 21st. The weather didn't hold anyone back and there was a great turn out both days despite the soggy conditions. Fortunately, the rain seemed to stop at the right times and we were able to carry on with most of the scheduled activities.

Friday night kicked off at 6:30 with a parade down main street. There were some great entries as well as lots of great entries in the kids bike parade. The kids' bike parade winners were Brody Froese, Taylor Townsend, Lukas Schacher, Jessica Prosofsky, Kylie Kempton. Following the parade the slo pitch tournament got under way with 2 games played on Friday evening. Once slo pitch was over the crowd moved into the outfield to watch the lawnmower races and burn out competition which is always a hit for everyone! This year's winner of the lawnmower races was Tyler Thall and the burn out competition was won by Jace Thall. The band Roundhouse entertained the crowd in the beer gardens and then our local talent was showcased with the karaoke machine! Our volunteer firefighters provided fireworks after dark. A diamond necklace draw was done and this was won by Susan Prosofsky.

Our silent auction began Friday evening and carried on into Saturday which included a variety of donated items from local and surrounding community members and businesses.

Things started up again first thing Saturday morning with a pancake breakfast prepared and served by Brightwater Insurance and Elance Steel. The skies cleared for a few hours and our minor ball teams were able to play a few games as well the slo pitch tournament continued throughout the day. The slo pitch A event was split between The Sons of Pitches and the Barrington Bears. The B event winners were Boozers Screwballs.

There was no shortage of entertainment for the kids throughout the day. DJ's amusements set up in the kidsville area and the kids were kept busy playing in the bouncy castles, riding the train, coloring and face painting. A tattoo artist was there to provide tattoos as well as a reptile show put on by Wrangler Elisa.

On Saturday night a delicious steak supper was prepared and served by the Hanley Lutheran Church. Once supper was done, everyone headed outside to watch the spud gun competition. This was won by Ellis Kempton. A diamond ring draw was held on Saturday night and this was won by Sammy Sekulich. A good crowd stuck around Saturday night to enjoy the beer gardens and some more karaoke.

The weekend was a lot of fun and a huge success. The weather didn't seem to dampen anyone's spirits. The Hanley Agricultural Society would not have been able to organize this event without the community and surrounding community's assistance and support. We want to let everyone know how much we appreciate the support. Hope to see everyone out again next year!
