NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE**April:**

The Town Office has received many concerns of wildlife coming through Town. The Town Council appointed a Predation Control Specialist that will be "on call" for the Town. If you sight wildlife in Town, please call the Town Office.

Unfortunately, the Council had to accept the resignation of Councillor Wendy Englot effective May 15. Wendy and husband Justin and children have moved to a house out of town. Thankfully, Wendy will still be very involved in the community.

The Council applied for New Deal Gas Tax Funding to assist in the purchase of a back-up generator at the water distribution plant that will automatically start the distribution pumps in the case of a power outage.

May:

The 2012 budget was adopted at the May meeting. The Council has planned for capital projects such as: completion of the paving project on Lincoln St. from the Post Office to 4th St.; the backup generator at the water plant; replacement of 4 water main valves (2 have been replaced already this past winter); more sidewalk replacements (completed); upgrades to the Municipal Software program in the Town Office (installed and is much more user friendly); and we have to capitalize the DRWU water line construction and plant upgrades this year (the project is basically complete except for some wiring). The municipal mill rates and minimum taxes will remain at the same as last year.

The Council entered into an agreement with the municipalities in the WaterWolf Land Use Planning District for a District Development Appeals Board. The new Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws are falling into place thanks to Adam Toth, Junior Planner for WaterWolf.

An annual donation was made to the Hanley Branch Library.

The 2011 Financial Statements were accepted as presented. The synopsis was included in your 2012 Tax Notices. If you have any questions in regards to the 2011 Statements, please go to the Town Office.

June:

At our June meeting the Council decided on a new mower and traded in the old one.

Steven Sira was hired as the summer employment student. He should have a busy summer with the moisture we've had so far!

The Town and the Hanley Composite School applied for funding through the Community Vitality Program to pay for half of the tennis court paving project located on the school grounds. Letters were sent to local organizations requesting assistance with funding but any donations will be gratefully accepted. The Town Council and School staff are hoping this outdoor facility will be used by everyone in the community for any activity that needs a smooth surface (basketball, tennis, roller hockey, skateboarding or rollerblading, remote control vehicle operation or practise bike riding for our toddlers).

The School and Town paving project was approved for a \$10,000 grant through the Community Vitality Fund. This is less than we applied for but we will be going ahead with the project and continue to fundraise. If you would like to make a donation to this project at any time, a charitable donation receipt may be made at the Town Office for any donation over \$10.

With the summer months upon us, the Council is reminding all residents to keep their yards and boulevards tidy. We have been complimented that our Town looks very nice and clean so let's keep up that reputation!

The next round of water/sewer/waste utility bills will be coming out at the end of June. Be sure to get your previous bill paid!

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

Media Events:

We have had a couple of exciting media announcements lately!

- The Town was selected along with 7 other communities for improvements to be made to the access road coming off Highway 11; and
- The Town was also selected as a test pilot project for electronic meters to be installed by SaskPower and SaskEnergy. They have moved in a sea-can and will be based out of that facility during the changeover of meters. See the information included in this Hermes!

Growth and Development:

The Real Estate market is still going strong! We have a number of new people in town. Let’s welcome the newcomers, and newcomers, be sure to get involved in your new community!

Construction season is upon us. Building permits are required for any new construction, erection, placement, alteration, repair, renovation or reconstruction. Permit packages can be picked up at the Town Office or downloaded off our website. Call the Town Office before submitting your package to be sure you have all the required information. Demolition permits are also required with permit applications at the Town Office or on our website.

Hanley and area chosen for test of utility advanced metering project

As part of an ongoing program to renew and prepare the province’s energy delivery system for the future, SaskPower and SaskEnergy have chosen the Town of Hanley and surrounding area as the first test location for their new advance metering infrastructure (AMI) project for electrical and gas meters.

Over the next few years, this program will ultimately result in everyone in Saskatchewan switching over to new power and natural gas meter technology.

Hanley was chosen as the location for the field tometer types, proximity to SaskPower and Sask-infrastructure.

During the Hanley field test, SaskPower and and 50 gas modules that will be mounted on corporations to verify the system configuration

SaskPower customers will experience a power meters are replace with new AMI meters. SaskEnergy customers will see no disruption to their service when the modules are installed on their meters.

Installation of the new meters and natural gas modules is expected to begin on June 11, and take no more than two weeks to complete.

As part of the test, electric and gas service for customers in Hanley and area will not change at this time. Meters will still be read by SaskPower and SaskEnergy staff on the same schedule; billing processes will also not change at this time.

Fluoride varnish is a protective coating that is painted on a child's teeth to prevent cavities. It can also be painted on teeth that already have cavities. Fluoride can slow down or help stop cavities from getting bigger.

How is Fluoride Varnish Put On?

The varnish is painted onto your child's teeth using a small disposable brush. It takes only a few seconds and is easily accepted by children.
